



## St Benet's RC VA Primary School Pupil Premium Statement

### PUPIL PREMIUM 2016-2017

Pupil Premium is an allocation of additional funding provided to schools to support specific groups of children who are vulnerable to possible underachievement. These include pupils who are entitled to free school meals at any point in the last 6 years, those children looked after by the local authority and the children of armed service personnel.

#### St Benet's Pupil Premium Grant 2016-2017

At St Benet's we are really proud of how we provide inclusive education for all of our children. We have planned to allocate this funding to the following areas:

- The illustrative allocation has been based on the latest FSM Ever 6 data from the October 2015 census. Service and Looked after Children data is based on the latest information issued by the local authority in relation to the 2015/2016 pupil premium.
- The Pupil Premium rates for 2016-17 are primary FSM Pupils £1,320, secondary FSM Pupils £935, Post LAC £1,900 and Service Children £300. Funding for current LAC is distributed via the virtual head teacher.
- A total of £31,875 has been included in the budget based on: 24 pupils entitled to free school meals and 1 Service Children.
- In order to ensure transparency and accountability we publish how this funding is being used on our website.
- This funding has been allocated to the following areas:
  - o £14,240 – Intervention work – Teaching (Including Beanstalk reading volunteers)
  - o £12,490 – Intervention work – NTA
  - o £3,000 – Pastoral Care
  - o £2,250 – Attendance Officer

We additionally utilise our budget and devolve money depending upon individual needs.
